Safety Data Sheet (SDS) Requirements for Non-Hazardous Items

The Work Health and Safety Regulation of 2011 requires that importers, manufacturers, and suppliers of hazardous chemicals prepare safety data sheets (SDSs) and disclose chemical identities.

Regulation 329 requires a manufacturer or importer to determine whether a substance, mixture or article imported or manufactured is a hazardous chemical, and if so, to correctly classify the hazardous chemical.

Regulation 330 requires a manufacturer or importer of the hazardous chemical to prepare a safety data sheet, and to make this available on request to anyone asking for the SDS.

It Is <u>NOT</u> a mandatory requirement to prepare or provide an SDS for chemicals which are <u>NOT</u> classified as a hazardous chemical.

Zart Art has assessed the classification of the chemical for this item in accordance with the GHS as requested by the Work Health and Safety Regulation of 2011.

This product has been classified as a **NON-HAZARDOUS** chemical and therefore an SDS is **NOT** required.
